
Welcome Back




Key stage 1 and Early years have had a special delivery from the Phonic Fairy: a copy of her Alphabet Rhyme Time book!



Thank you for your continued patience and support with regards to dropping off & collecting children from school. Please can you ensure you are following the guidance below.

- Please adhere strictly to your drop off & collection times and do not loiter outside the gates.
- Maintain social distancing at all times during drop off & pick up
- We kindly ask that parents/carers wear face coverings when they drop off & pick up their children
- Please do not park on the school or vets car park when dropping off or collecting your children.


Appointments during the school day.

Green Campaigning



We are re-launching the Walk to School (WOW) campaign at Canon Burrows. WOW is a pupil-led initiative where children self-report how they get to school every day using an interactive WOW Travel Tracker. If they travel sustainably (walk, cycle, bus, park & stride) once a week for a month, they get rewarded with a badge. Each day, a child in each class will report how many children are making greener journeys. Even if you have to drive to school, your child can still get a badge if you park at least a ten minute walk away. We also appreciate that walking is not something that everybody is able to do. WALK TO SCHOOL - IT'S ONE WIN AFTER ANOTHER

HAPPIER CHILDREN

Children who do some form of exercise, especially a walk before school, arrive refreshed, fit and ready to learn.

CLEANER AIR

In the UK, one in four cars during the morning rush hour are taking children to school. The school run alone is responsible for generating half a million tonnes of carbon dioxide per year (which is more than some small countries!). By walking to school just once per week you can help improve the quality of air your child is growing up in.

SAFER JOURNEYS

The Walk to school is another opportunity for your child to learn road safety.

YOUR HEALTH

If you walk to school with your child, you will get fitter too!

YOUR TIME

Fed up of the traffic and finding a parking space at the school gate? Walking to school can be just as quick as driving and is a nice way to spend a few moments chatting with your child about their day and yours.

YOUR WALLET

Don't forget you can save money by spending less on petrol.

Covid Guidance

Issues around not following government guidance:

As you will appreciate staff and parents who send their children to school are trusting that everyone else coming into school are following the strict guidance around national restrictions and not mixing with other households. If there is evidence on social media that these restrictions are being broken or if the children are telling us they are visiting family and friends, attending birthday parties or going for tea at someone else's house outside of their bubble, then obviously staff and other parents are going to be genuinely concerned. Please do not be offended if you are asked about these concerns. We are purely trying to keep everyone as safe as they possibly can be. School may choose to ask that your child isolated for a period of 10 days if they have mixed with other bubbles.

Free rapid testing for all as COVID restrictions eased

All adults in Tameside are now able to access free, regular, rapid coronavirus testing as part of the easing of COVID restrictions.

Alongside the rollout of the vaccine, regular testing of those without symptoms is an essential part of the easing of restrictions as it will help to quickly suppress the spread of COVID and break the chain of transmission. The rapid lateral flow tests are quick, easy and give a result within half an hour.

To help best protect the community it's recommended that everyone gets tested twice a week. If you receive a positive result you should isolate and book a confirmatory PCR test.

Remember, these test are only for those who are asymptomatic (do not have any symptoms). If you have symptoms, you need to have a PCR test.

The DFE advise that primary-aged pupils should only be tested if they are symptomatic, in which case their families should follow the guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection and book a PCR test for the child.

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Our school is delighted to be taking part in Royal Mail's Heroes Stamp Design Competition, honouring the heroes of the coronavirus pandemic.

Eight pupils from primary and secondary schools across the UK will become the designers of this stamp set, and one could be your child!

Each entry we send in will have the name of each child, plus their age and our school's name and postcode.

Before we submit entries to Royal Mail we need explain how Royal Mail will use these details.

Royal Mail will use these details of children who enter (i.e. name, age, school name and postcode) to run the competition, including to contact the winners and distribute prizes. Royal Mail will share this information with iChild Limited and The Education Company Limited, who are helping Royal Mail to run the competition.

Except in the case of the 120 children who reach the Regional Finalists stage, Royal Mail will delete all of this data by 30th September 2021.

As is usual in competitions, Royal Mail may, if requested, tell the Advertising Standards Authority of those winners' surnames and counties. Members of the public will also be able to ask Royal Mail for that information after 30th September 2021. If you object to your child's surname and county being available to members of the public, you should write to Heroes Stamp Design Competition, Royal Mail Group, 185 Farringdon Road, London EC1A 1AA. However, Royal Mail may still need to give this information to the Advertising Standards Authority on a confidential basis.

If your child enters the competition, Royal Mail has what data protection law calls a "legitimate interest" to use your child's details (i.e. name, age, school name and postcode) in the ways described above. However, your decision of what is best for your child takes priority, so if you have any concerns please let your child's teacher know not to include your child's design in the competition.
