

School drop off & pick up

Thank you for your continued patience and support with regards to dropping off & collecting children from school. Please can you ensure you are following the guidance below.

- Please adhere strictly to your drop off & collection times and do not loiter outside the gates.
- Maintain social distancing at all times during drop off & pick up
- We kindly ask that parents/carers wear face coverings when they drop off & pick up their children
- Please do not park on the school or vets car park when dropping off or collecting your children.



Please do not send children into school if they are waiting for Covid-19 test results or if they have symptoms of Covid-19 (cough, temperature, loss of taste or smell); take them for Covid-19 PCR test. Please inform school if you have tested positive for Covid-19 or are waiting for test results.

Please could all parents/carers make sure that they are checking emails regularly and check that notifications are turned on, on their SchoolComms App. We are sending out lots of electronic communication at the moment and we don't want you to miss any important messages.

Alternative pick up arrangements

Please can parents/carers ensure that they let the office know if someone else is collecting their child, where possible by 2pm each day. This ensures that those who are sending children out are aware that they are going with another adult. Please can you also have a password ready, so we can ensure the identity of the person on arrival this will be recorded for future use.

Nursery Places

Parents of children currently attending Canon Burrows, who have a younger sibling approaching 3 years of age, can apply for a nursery place. Please contact the office for more information.

Children's belongings

Please can parents/carers ensure their child(ren) have everything they need at the very start of the school day in order to avoid multiple visits from parents/carers and other family members/friends to the gate. This will reduce the number of objects being passed from person to person and help reduce the risk of spread of infection.

What do I need to do to visit the pop-up store?

If you are in Nursery, Reception, Year 1, Year 2, Year 3 or Year 4:

Read five times a week with an adult and this needs to be written in your reading diary by an adult at home.

If you are in Year 5 or Year 6:

Read five times a week — one of these five times must be with an adult. Each time you read, you must write in your reading diary with either a summary of the key events or your thoughts about what you have read. The adult you read with must write in your diary at least once per week.

Your reading diary needs to be in school every day for your teacher to see please.

We would really encourage you to read the weekends too – the more reading you do, the better!

When will the book store be open?

The Canon Burrows Pop Up Book Store will be open from next half term!

Reception, Year 1 and 2's first day will be Friday 11th June and

KS2's will be Friday 18th June.

Emotionally Based School Avoidance (EBSA) and accessing further support Information for parents and carers

COVID-19 has brought many challenges for children and young people (CYP), including changes to their usual school attendance and education. Many CYP will have returned to school easily; for others, there may be new or pre-existing feelings of worry or anxiety about attending school which might affect their school attendance.

Services across Tameside are supporting schools, families and young people who experience, or are most at risk of, emotionally based school avoidance (EBSA). We recognise the importance of working closely with parents and carers in reducing children and young people's feelings of anxiety and increasing their attendance/ supporting their return to education.

If your child is struggling with the return to school, or has struggled to attend previously, due to feeling worried or anxious, we would like to invite you to attend a virtual workshop. This will include information around anxiety and EBSA from the Educational Psychology Service, as well as information from different support services across Tameside, including:

- Early Years, Early Help and Neighbourhoods team
- Healthy Young Minds
- Kooth
- SENDIASS Special Educational Needs and Disability Information, Advice and Support Service

There will be an opportunity to ask questions but we are unable to discuss individual cases within the workshop.

The virtual sessions will take place on:

- Tuesday 8th June, 6-7pm
- Thursday 10th June, 1:30-2:30pm
- Monday 14th June, 10:30-11:30am
