




Please can we remind all parents/carers to wear a face mask for drop off & pick up to help stop the spread of Covid-19.


This year's Summer Reading Challenge will launch in libraries on Saturday 10th July and children can also take part online at wildworldheroes.org.uk

Dear Parent / Guardian

We are pleased to announce that we have organised a clothes & shoe collection with Bag2School in order to raise money for our school fund.

Bag2School is the UK's leading textile recycler and fundraiser working with schools and since its inception in 2001 it has now paid out over £36 million.

As well as raising vitally needed funds for school it also helps the environment by helping to divert unwanted textiles away from landfill. A recent DEFRA report has shown that textile collection schemes are helping to reduce the volume of textiles discarded as municipal solid waste. However it is a fact that as a nation we still send 350,000 tonnes of textiles to landfill every year.

By getting involved in our <code>Bag2School</code> collection, you have an opportunity to sort through your cupboards and wardrobes and donate unwanted textiles — this can include adults' and children's clothes, shoes (tied together please), hats, belts, handbags and soft toys, (please refer to http://uk.bag2school.com/ for full details). In addition to raising much needed funds it will also raise awareness amongst the children of the benefits of recycling and reuse.

Please put your items in a black bin-bag and don't forget to ask grandparents, friends and neighbours to have a sort out as well!
