Spring 2 - What lives in God's wonderful world?

We will be learning all about our wonderful world, and all that it has to offer: the places, animals and weather. We will also be thinking about how we can look after the planet.

Communication and Language: We will continue to encourage the children to explain their thinking and will be modelling answering How? and Why? questions. We will be showing the children how to retell stories with story language and be encouraging them to use these stories within their role play. We will listen to and talk about stories to build familiarity and understanding, expecting the children to talk in sentences. We will be learning rhymes, poems and songs.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development: This half term we will be learning about relating to others and making good relationships and friendships. We will continue to celebrate the children showing the Christian Values of friendship and thankfulness by giving them value vouchers. We will celebrate differences and support them to identify and moderate their own feelings socially and emotionally. The children will be actively encouraged to think about their own feelings and those of others

Physical Development: We will continue to develop our motor skills to develop our readiness for writing by focussing on teaching and modelling the correct letter formation. We will continue to check how the children are holding and using pencils, scissors, knives, forks and spoons. We will look to support the children to move with greater control and grace through PE.

Literacy: We will continue to practise oral blending for reading and segmenting for spelling. Alongside this, we will review Phase 3, words with double letters, longer words and words ending in -ing. We will continue to practise writing sentences.

Maths: We will consolidate our learning about length, height and time as well as continue to apply the counting principles when counting to 9 and 10. We will learn to represent 9 and 10 in different ways and count out the required number of objects from a larger group. We will learn to arrange 9 or 10 items into small groups and begin to develop a greater understanding of number bonds to 10. We will continue to develop our subitising skills to 6.

Understanding the World: We will hear the Easter story and also learn about Ramadan. We will use stories and photographs to look at some environments that are different to the ones in which we live. We will learn about Siberian tigers and their natural environment, which links to one of our core books, Augustus and His Smile. We will continue to explore the natural world draw and discuss the changes that we observe linked with the changes in seasons. We will explore the natural world around us and ask the children to describe what they see, hear and feel. We will build 3D maps and create journey sticks.

Expressive Arts and Design: We will learn songs and body percussion to perform at the Jack and the Beanstalk event. We will learn to perform individually or in small groups. We will continue to develop simple storylines in our pretend play. We will explore different art media, including observational paintings of natural objects and clay animal sculptures.

THINGS TO REMEMBER

Our PE day is now on a <u>Thursday</u>. Please ensure children come to school in their PE kit. Jogging bottoms and a jacket are necessary in the colder weather.
