Alternative payment method for clubs/trips



If you are having problems paying for a club/trips via the School Gateway app, it is possible to make a payment at any PayPoint store.

To do this you will need to phone or text the school office with your child's name and details of the club/trip you would like to pay for. The office staff will then be able to issue a voucher for you to collect and take to a PayPoint store to pay.

Please note that PayPoint payments are not credited to school immediately, unlike the School Gateway app, but by 11am the following working day. If you are making an urgent payment, please ensure you do this with adequate time for the payment to go through.

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
