

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TOOTH DECAY IN CHILDREN ON THE RISE

<u>BAD NEWS</u> - 30% of five-year-olds and 46% of eight-year-olds have tooth decay in their baby and adult teeth, and this problem continues as children get older. 34% of 12-year-olds and almost 50% of 15-year-olds have decay in adult teeth. Tooth decay causes pain, often resulting in days off school and parents having to take time off work.

Tooth decay left untreated can lead to tooth loss in children. The loss of baby teeth through decay can severely affect the alignment of adult teeth and result in more treatment and even braces. By the age of 7 most children have some adult (permanent) teeth, early loss of adult teeth can create serious problems in the future.

GOOD NEWS - The good news is nearly all dental disease is preventable.

How teeth are cared for during a child's early years has a strong impact on the health of their teeth in adulthood. Mouth health plays a vital role in a child's general well-being, reducing decay and protecting their teeth for years to come.

It is highly recommended that children should go to the dentist with their parents/guardian as soon as possible to get them used to the noises, smells and surroundings and prepare them for future visits. You should then take them regularly, as often as your dental team recommend. The earlier these visits start, the more relaxed the children will be in future appointments.

Oldham Road Dental Surgery has recently come under new management, recently taken over by Mrs Amna Butt (formerly Dr Hafiz's dental surgery) and we have some spaces to register under 16s for NHS treatment.

If your child is currently not registered with, or not seen a dentist for some time please call us on 0161 339 5426 and a member of our team will be happy to help and arrange a new patient exam.
