



2A Sentences

2A sentences have 2 **adjectives** before a noun:

The **glamorous, intelligent** princess kissed the **grotesque, warty** frog.

adjective

comma

adjective

noun



In Year 3, we use 3 adjectives to describe a noun to form a 2A sentence.

Here are some examples:

Adjective, adjective, noun followed by adjective, adjective, noun.

There was a tall, pink flamingo in the clear, tranquil lagoon.

Key points:

- Remember to include a comma between the adjectives.
- Think of a sentence with two nouns before you begin writing to make it easier.
- Be creative with your adjective. Reflect on your words chosen – have you chosen the best suited adjective?
- You may want to use a thesaurus if you have one at home. If not try this website, <https://www.rhymezone.com/>. On the website, click 'synonyms' on the drop down list to find other words that are similar in meaning.
