Use a <u>dictionary</u> to clarify any unfamiliar vocabulary.
<b>Tuesday-</b> Read a newspaper article about a famous person. What can you tell about the person from the language used? Does the article criticise them or is it complimentary – how can you tell? Write the <b>meaning</b> , <b>synonyms</b> (word with the same/similar meaning) and <b>antonyms</b> (word that has the opposite meaning) for each word.
<b>Wednesday-</b> Click <u>here</u> for a reading comprehension activity about a <b>famous botanist</b> . Challenge yourself to read the text in under 3 minutes and complete the comprehension questions.	Wednesday- <mark>Mind map - write the name of the significant person in the middle of your page and fill the page surrounding it with vocabulary that you associate with the following significant people: The Queen, <u>Guy Fawkes, Helena Lucas</u> and <u>Rosa Parks</u>.</mark>
Thursday- Visit <u>Ducksters</u> and choose a person that interests you to read about. Can you record 10 facts about your chosen person?	<b>Thursday-</b> Can you complete <u>this segment puzzle</u> (click Spelling Tiles) which focuses on words ending in: <b>-able, -ible, -ably and -ibly</b> ?

<b>Monday-</b> Visit the Literacy Shed for this wonderful resource on <u>The Clocktower</u> and/or ask write a letter/email to an important family member updating them on events from the last few weeks.	<b>Monday-</b> What different calculations can you create when adding and subtracting the numbers <b>111, 8276, 529, 18391, 9238</b> and <b>4163</b> ? Make sure you check it is correct using the inverse operation. <u>CHALLENGE:</u> Can you make some decimal numbers and add these to one of the whole numbers?
<b>Tuesday-</b> Using the words <b>FAMOUS PEOPLE</b> , can you write an acrostic poem about significant British people in history.	<b>Tuesday-</b> Go to <u>https://www.topmarks.co.uk/</u> and search for 'Addition and Subtraction – Hexafield 2110 game', play this to improve your speed and accuracy in solving addition and subtraction calculations.
Wednesday- Listen to Martin Luther King's speech <u>I Have a Dream</u> . Can you write your own speech about your dreams? Use similar techniques to Martin Luther King such as repetition, personification and powerful verbs. This website is excellent for helpful hints and ideas when writing your speech: https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zv7fqp3/articles/z4w96v4	<b>Wednesday-</b> Play this <u>missing box addition game</u> or <u>missing box subtraction game</u> . You can work on the level that adds/subtracts 3 digits by clicking on the orange three. Can you make your own addition/subtraction calculations like this?

<ul> <li>Thursday- Create an information report about a significant/famous person of interest.</li> <li>You may choose a famous author, athlete, popstar or even a local hero such as a doctor or nurse.</li> <li>Include: birthplace, what they're most famous for, significant events/achievements and any other interesting facts.</li> </ul>	Thursday- Roll a dice and make a 6 digit number (target number). If you do not have a dice, make up a 6 digit number. Write 2 addition and 2 subtraction calculations where the answer is the target number given. Make this easier by reducing the number of digits in the target number.
<b>Friday-</b> Following on from the significant person you chose for yesterday's task, write in role and create a short autobiography of their life. Think about the person's emotions during key parts of their life.	<b>Friday-</b> Find out when each family member was born and record this. Add all of the years up together and find a total. Add up the years from the same generation - which decade has the most/least members?

### Learning Project - to be done throughout the week

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to learn more about famous or significant people. Learning may focus on past or present inventors, explorers or scientists and how they influence society today.

- Famous Brits- Lots of significant people in history have been British. Emmeline Pankhurst, Guy Fawkes and Mary Anning are just a few. Research one of these or another famous Brit of their choice. You could create a fact file, a presentation, a chronological report of their life or present their research in any way you like.
- <u>The Queen's Speech-</u>The Queen <u>spoke to the nation</u> on Sunday 5th April from Windsor Castle. She had an important speech to deliver where she wanted to thank people for what they were doing and to give hope that things would eventually return to normal. Think about what you would say if you had to speak to the nation. What messages of hope would you want to give to your friends and family? You could write your speech or record yourself delivering your speech.
- Inspiration for Inventors- These inventors talk about where they found the inspiration for their inventions. What problems do you incur in your daily life? What inventions would make your life easier? How could you turn your idea into a product? Mind map ideas of how you could solve your problem before designing and annotating a product. You may even want to make a prototype or test parts of your design to see if it would work.
- Significant to Me- Discuss with your parents/carers a person who is significant to you. This could be a famous person who has inspired you or someone who has made a positive impact on you. Discuss the attributes that this person has why are they inspiring? Your parents/carers could discuss with you a person who is significant to them. Can you draw a picture of the person who is significant to you?
- <u>What it Takes-</u> Watch <u>this interview</u> with Paralympic gold medallist Helena Lucas. In this interview she talks about the dedication needed to be a successful sportsperson. Set yourself a goal to work on every day. You could create a poster outlining your goal and the steps you will take each day to work towards it. You may want to include steps you will take when you return to school.

🔺 A is for Activity – this is the QR code sheet on which the children will have six QR codes they can scan and play games using a phone or tablet

😢 V is for Video – this is a native speaker video that the children can watch, and join in with any activities

By accessing these activities, videos and vocabulary, the children will be able to practise their language learning at home and revisit any previous topics they have covered, if they wish.
