Monday- During your daily reading, play some classical music, rock music, jazz music and pop music. Draw an emoji to represent how each music genre made you feel whilst you were reading. Learning Project - to be done throughout the week

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for you to learn more about music. Learning may focus on famous musicians, listening to and performing music and exploring a range of music genres and instruments.

- <u>Sound Effects-</u>Many audio books use sound effects to enhance the retelling of books. Think about a narrative that you are currently reading or have read recently. What sound effects would enhance the retelling of the story? Source a range of props to help add sound effects and record the retelling of the story with your sound effects. Remember to tweet a video of your retelling to the school Twitter using #TheLearningProjects. Make sure to ask a parent's permission first.
- <u>Carnival Time-</u> The Rio carnival is a spectacle of samba, costumes and dance and takes place every year. <u>Here are</u> some of the pictures from this year's parade. Research the samba inspired costumes and headdresses worn during the parades. Design, label and make your own mask or headdress taking inspiration from the research completed.
- Expression- Kandinsky felt that he could express emotions and music through colours and shapes within his painting. Create a piece of artwork inspired by your favourite piece of music. Listen to the music several times and feel free to draw or paint the emotion you feel at the time. Tweet us your art so that we can share it. Remember to ask a parent's permission first.
- <u>I'm with the Band!-</u> Create your own musical instrument. This could be a cereal box guitar, drums or shakers. You may even want to make a range of instruments to create a family band. Decorate your instruments to make them appealing. After this, you can research which famous musicians perform with their chosen instrument and watch videos of their performance to inspire your own!
- <u>Music Video Directors-</u> Using the song you created for your writing task this week, think about the sort of music video that you could create to go with it. You could storyboard your ideas and think about whether you need any props or even come up with a dance routine before recording it.

Making Instruments

- A kazoo is a simple wind instrument that allows the player to create sound by humming.
- You will need a cardboard tube, square of grease proof paper and an elastic band. Cover the end of the tube in paper and secure it in place using the elastic band.
- Hum a tune into the open end of the kazoo. What happens to the kazoo? What happens to the sound of your voice?
- Learn more about sound by researching how ears work and different ears are adapted to different environments. Find out why elephants have such big ears.

- <u>Spanish-</u> We have uploaded the home learning grid on to our website. There is one page with a number of activities for all stages of language learning. Year 6 are Stage 4. For each language learning stage, we have selected five topics from the Scheme of Work, and within each topic we have put three buttons:
 - A is for Activity this is the QR code sheet on which the children will have six QR codes they can scan and play games using a phone or tablet
 - K is for Knowledge Organiser now that the audio has been added, the children can now practise the key vocabulary and phonics for their topic and share it with their family at home.
- V is for Video this is a native speaker video that the children can watch, and join in with any activities

By accessing these activities, videos and vocabulary, the children will be able to practise their language learning at home and revisit any previous topics they have covered, if they wish.

- <u>Picture News</u> Each week, Picture News choose a news story, provide an image and a thought-provoking question to encourage children to engage with current affairs and think deeply.
