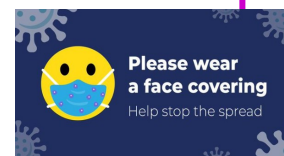


Please make sure you regularly check your emails, as this is our main method of communicating with parents. Letters, year group pages and other school information will also be on the school website.

### Clean Air Plan Consultation

Views are sought on Greater Manchester's Clean Air Plans to reduce harmful air pollution on our local roads.

Government has instructed Greater Manchester to introduce a charging Clean Air Zone right across all ten local authority areas, including Tameside. Some vehicles that don't meet emissions standards will have to pay a daily charge to drive in and around the zone. That includes buses, coaches, heavy goods vehicles, taxis, private hire, vans, and minibuses. Private cars and motorbikes are not affected.

To help local people, businesses and organisations prepare, Greater Manchester is asking for more than £150 million of government funding to support upgrades to cleaner, compliant vehicles. Those who upgrade before the Clean Air Zone is introduced in 2022 would not have to pay a daily charge.
