During our Anti-bullying week, all the children have been engaging in activities to encourage kindness, friendship and acceptance of others. Across school children have been creating designs that show their anti-bullying stance on jigsaw pieces, some of which will be used for a display to show that we're all a piece in the puzzle, and together, we're united against bullying. In EYFS & Year 1, the children have been focusing on friendship and spreading kindness to friends and family. Year 2 have been looking to spread kindness to the elderly, Year 3 spreading kindness to children outside school, Year 4 have been looking at acceptance of those with disabilities, Year 5 have learnt about the effects of bullying on mental health and Year 6 have learnt about some of the difficulties faced by migrants.
