Our Posada will begin its journey on Monday. Posada is a Spanish word that means 'inn', and is a Mexican tradition during Advent. The tradition used to be that two young people, dressed as Mary and Joseph, travelled from house to house in their village to proclaim the imminent arrival of Jesus and request that they be given a room. Today, we use nativity figures and these can be passed from class to class within the school community, during Advent and returning on the last day of term ready to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ on Christmas Day. Mary and Joseph's journey to the homes of children in our school reminds us that we need to make room for Jesus in our lives, homes and communities. The figures can sit on the sofa to listen to a story, sit up at the table during meal times, and even be put to bed in the spare room. They travel with a box with suggestions for prayers and activities, a candle and also a journal for diary entries, photos and pictures about their activities to be slotted in.

Please can all school sports kits be returned to Mr. Richardson as soon as possible, so they can be used by other children in the large number of events we have involving school teams. Thank you.








