



Learning from Home

Use the ideas below, alongside this week's resource, to support your home learning.

Design your dream home! Include its location, what type of home it will be e.g. a tree house, boat, bungalow, caravan, castle and what its exterior and interior will look like. Create your design using labelled diagrams and short descriptions. Challenge – can you create a bird's eye view drawing (floor plan) of the interior design? Use your mathematical skills and knowledge to create your drawing to scale!

Select a period in history e.g. Ancient Egypt, Romans, Vikings, Ancient Greeks, Victorian Britain. Find out how their homes were designed and built. How were they the same/different to homes today?

The natural home or environment of a plant or animal is called a habitat. Find out which animals and plants live in the two habitats: a pond and a woodland. Explore other habitats and the plants and animals that live in them.



Measure the size of different rooms in your home. Use a tape measure, a ruler or measure it using your own feet. You could explore further and find the area and perimeter of rooms in your home.

Has anyone in your family or anyone you know ever lived in a different country? Locate these countries on a map of the world. Can you name any other countries? Where in the world would you live?

Draw a picture and write a description of your own home. Include what you like/don't like about it, where it is, what is near it, what it looks like.
