<u>Photography</u>

Ascension Day is a perfect time to think about our amazing world that God has created; this will be our focus for our entries for this year's Spirited Arts Competition – a competition we have previously won. As part of your learning this week, we would like you to take photographs that answers the question **'Where is God?'** for you.

<u>Where is God?</u>

In your heart, in prayer, in the temple or the universe? Or is he hiding? Is he not there at all? Where would you look for God? Would you search with google or a 'goddetector'? Is God on Instagram or WhatsApp? Can God be found by prayer or by looking among the world's

Read the information about Ascension Day using the Power Point on your home learning page. Discuss what happened after Jesus died and rose again at Easter. Read the Ascension Day information sheet. Can you use the information to answer the questions about Ascension Day? The answers are there to help you too.	Imagine you are one of Jesus' disciples at his ascension or at Pentecost; how would you feel about what you had seen? What questions would you have? What would you be telling the people around you? Can you write a diary entry as though you are one of Jesus' disciples? Remember your writing will need to be written in the first person and past tense.
Be Active Can you create a dance that shows how Jesus ascended to heaven? Go for a walk and find the most amazing thing that God created. Recommendation at least 2 hours of exercise <i>a week.</i>	 Wondering Talk about Why do Christians think Jesus was resurrected? What is the most important part of the story of Pentecost? What was it like to be there at the first Pentecost? Why is Pentecost often called the Birthday of the Church?
<u>The Arts</u>	

- Look at artwork that shows Jesus' ascension: <u>The Ascension</u>. What does it show? What do you like and dislike about it? Has the artist used particular colours? Has the artist focused on a particular aspect of the ascension?
- Can you draw or paint your own piece to show the ascension?
- Can you create a piece or art a picture or sculpture that shows something you are grateful for in God's world.
- Can you take a photograph to show 'Where is God?' for the Spirited Arts Competition?

<u>STEM Challenge</u>

Can you create a 'elevation system' to show Jesus' ascension? You could use a lego man or a drawing to represent Jesus. How will you get 'Jesus' to move upwards? Could your D&T learning about the Great Fire of London in Year 2 help?

Top tip: could a pulley help?
